INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to give you information on the proposals to grant to the Directors general mandates to issue Shares and to repurchase Shares. These proposals have been proposed as special business for your consideration and, if thought fit, approval at the 2007 AGM.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE SHARES AND TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the Annual General Meeting duly convened and held on 19th May 2006, ordinary resolutions were approved by Shareholders to grant to the Directors a general mandate to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares and a further general mandate to allot, issue and deal with new Shares. Such general mandates, unless renewed, will lapse at the conclusion of the 2007 AGM.

2007 AGM

You will find set out on pages 14 to 17 of this circular a notice convening the Annual General Meeting at which, three ordinary resolutions numbered (5), (6) and (7) will be proposed respectively as special business to:

- grant to the Directors a general mandate to exercise all the powers of the Company to purchase on the Stock Exchange Shares representing up to 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the Shares in issue as at the date of the passing of such resolution;
- grant to the Directors a general mandate, and authorize them, to issue, allot and deal with new Shares with an aggregate nominal amount as at the date of passing such resolution not exceeding 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the Shares in issue as at the date of the passing of such resolution;
- extend the general mandate which will be granted to the Directors to issue, allot and deal with new Shares by adding to it the number of Shares actually repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate after the granting of the general mandate.

A proxy form for use by the Shareholders at the 2007 AGM is enclosed herewith. Whether or not you intend to attend the 2007 AGM, you are requested to complete the accompanying proxy form in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and return it to the registered office of the Company at 7th Floor, Goldlion Holdings Centre, 13-15 Yuen Shun Circuit, Siu Lek Yuen, Shatin, New Territories, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the 2007 AGM or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of a proxy form will not prevent you from attending and voting in person at the 2007 AGM or any adjourned meeting thereof if you so wish.

PROCEDURES FOR DEMANDING A POLL

Pursuant to Article 73 of the Company's Articles of Association, a resolution put to the vote of a general meeting of the Shareholders shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is (before the declaration of the result of the show of hands or on the withdrawal of any other demand for a poll) demanded by:

- (i) the chairman of the meeting; or
- (ii) at least three Shareholders present in person or by proxy or by representative for the time being entitled to vote at the meeting; or
- (iii) any Shareholder or Shareholders present in person or by proxy or by representative and representing not less than one-tenth of the total voting rights of all the Shareholders having the right to vote at the meeting; or

- (iv) any Shareholder or Shareholders present in person or by proxy or by representative and holding Shares conferring a right to vote at the meeting being Shares on which an aggregate sum has been paid up equal to not less than one-tenth of the total sum paid up on all the Shares conferring that right.

RECOMMENDATION

The Directors believe that the above proposals are in the best interests of the Company and Shareholders as a whole and accordingly recommend that all Shareholders vote in favour of the resolutions to be proposed at the 2007 AGM.

This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide requisite information to you for your consideration whether to vote for or against the resolution to approve the grant of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors.

This Appendix also constitutes the memorandum required under Section 49BA(3) of the Companies Ordinance.

1. LISTING RULES REQUIREMENTS FOR SHARE REPURCHASE

All on-market share repurchases must be made in accordance with the Listing Rules, which set out various restrictions with which listed companies have to comply. In particular:

- (a) no Shares may be repurchased unless they are fully paid-up; and
- (b) a listed Company may not purchase its own shares on the Stock Exchange unless, among other matters, its shareholders shall have given in advance a specific approval or a general mandate to the directors of the listed Company to make such purchases.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the total issued share capital of the Company comprised 937,114,035 Shares. It is also expected that the Company would issue 45,000,000 Shares to Keysonic Development Limited ("KDL") by the end of April 2007 as partial consideration in completing the acquisition of Joint Corporation Limited (details of the transaction were disclosed in the related circular of the Company to its Shareholders dated 12th February 2007). As a result, the total number of issued share capital of the Company at the date of the 2007 AGM would expect to be 982,114,035 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution approving the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the date of the 2007 AGM, based on the total issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase up to 93,711,403 Shares, or 98,211,403 Shares if the Company has issued the above-mentioned 45,000,000 Shares to KDL before the date of the 2007 AGM.

3. REASONS FOR REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders to have a general authority from Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase Shares in the market. Such repurchase may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value of the Company and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and its Shareholders.

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASE

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Ordinance and the Listing Rules. It is envisaged that such funds should only be paid from the distributable profits of the Company and/or the proceeds of a new issue of Shares made for the purpose of the repurchase to the extent allowable under the Companies Ordinance.

It is possible that, if the Repurchase Mandate were to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period, there might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31st December 2006. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to the extent that the repurchase would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital position of the Company or its gearing levels which, in the opinion of the Directors, are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

6. UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the Repurchase Mandate only in accordance with the Listing Rules, the applicable laws of Hong Kong and the regulations set out in the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Company.

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge and belief having made all reasonable enquiries, their respective associates, have any present intention, if the Repurchase Mandate is exercised, to sell any Shares to the Group.

No other connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Group, or have undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

7. TAKEOVERS CODE

If, as a result of a share repurchase, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and thereby become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

The Directors are not aware of any consequences which would arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchases of Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate.

8. SUBSTANTIAL SHAREHOLDERS AND PUBLIC SHAREHOLDING

So far as is known to the Directors, the following parties, other than a Director or chief executive of the Company, have, as at the Latest Practicable Date, an interest or short position in the Shares and underlying Shares which would fall to be disclosed to the Company under the provisions of the Division 2 and 3 of Part XV of the SFO, or who was, directly or indirectly, interested in 5% or more of the nominal value of any class of share capital carrying rights to vote in all circumstances at general meetings of any other member of the Group:

HSBC International Trustee Limited holds 339,530,000 shares and 228,504,750 shares of the Shares for Gold Trustee Holding Corporation and Silver Trustee Holding Corporation respectively. Gold Trustee Holding Corporation and Silver Trustee Holding Corporation act as trustees, respectively, for the Gold Unit Trust and the Silver Unit Trust, which units (other than 2 units each of which are beneficially owned by Dr. Tsang Hin Chi and Madam Wong Lei Kuan respectively) are beneficially owned by the Tsang Family Trust. Silver Disk Limited is wholly owned by the Silver Unit Trust and its holding in Shares comprised part of the number of Shares held by HSBC International Trustee Limited for Silver Trustee Holding Corporation.

As KDL is wholly owned by Silver Unit Trust, the expected issue of 45,000,000 Shares to KDL as mentioned above would increase the shareholding of HSBC International Trustee Limited (hold for Silver Trustee Holding Corporation, being trustee of Silver Unit Trust) to 613,034,750 Shares, or 62.42% of the total issued share capital of the Company. On this basis and in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full, the number of Shares held by HSBC International Trustee Limited would be increased to about 69.36% of the issued share capital of the Company and the number of Shares held by the public, so far as the Directors are aware, would not fall below 25%. In any case, the Directors have no present intention to exercise the power to repurchase Shares to the extent that the aggregate number of Shares held by public shareholders comprises less than 25% of the issued share capital of the Company.

9. SHARES REPURCHASES MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company has not repurchased any Shares, whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise, in the six months prior to the Latest Practicable Date.

Dr. the Honourable Tsang Hin Chi, *G.B.M., (Executive Director)* aged 73, is the Chairman and one of the founders of the Group. Dr. Tsang holds an honorary doctorate from Zhong Shan University in the People's Republic of China ("PRC"). He is a standing committee member of the National People's Congress of the PRC, honorary vice chairman of All-China Federation of Industry & Commerce, ex-officio life honorary chairman of The Chinese General Chamber of Commerce, and sits on the committees of several Hong Kong and Mainland trade associations. He is also the director of Tsang Hin Chi Manned Space Foundation, director of Tsang Hin Chi Education Foundation, Ministry of Education of the PRC, deputy managing director of Jinan University Guangzhou, honorary president of Jiaying University Guangdong, and an honorary citizen of Beijing, Harbin, Shenyang, Dalin and Guangzhou.

Dr. Tsang is the husband of Madam Wong Lei Kuan and the father of Mr. Tsang Chi Ming, Ricky, both of whom are executive Directors of the Company. Save as disclosed herein, he has no other relationships with any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Dr. Tsang is deemed to be interested in 1,210,000 Shares through the interest of Madam Wong Lei Kuan, and 568,034,750 Shares being controlled by the Tsang Family Trust, a discretionary trust established by Dr. Tsang, the discretionary objects of which are members of his family including Madam Wong Lei Kuan and Mr. Tsang Chi Ming, Ricky. Save as aforesaid, he has no other interest in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Dr. Tsang is entitled to annual emoluments of HK\$3,900,000 which are determined with reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Company. In addition, he is also entitled to receive an annual bonus to be determined by reference to the Group's performance and profitability.

Dr. Tsang has entered into a service agreement with the Company with no specific term but can be terminated by either party giving to the other six months' notice. He is subject to retirement and eligible for re-election in accordance with the Articles of Association of the Company.

Save as disclosed herein, there is no other information relating to Dr. Tsang's re-election that needs to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of Rule 13.51 (2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters relating to his re-election that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Mr. Tsang Chi Ming, Ricky, *(Executive Director)* aged 40, is the Deputy Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of the Company overseeing the development and operations of the Group's business. Mr. Tsang joined the Group in 1989 and was appointed as an executive director in 2001. He is a committee member of the C.P.P.C.C. Guangzhou, standing committee member of Beijing Youth Federation, director of Young Entrepreneur Association of China, executive vice chairman of Guangdong Chamber of Foreign Investors, director of Jinan University Guangzhou, chairman of Ka Ying Chow Commercial Association Limited, standing committee member of The Chinese General Chamber of Commerce and an honorary citizen of Guangzhou and Meizhou.

Mr. Tsang is a son of Dr. Tsang Hin Chi and Madam Wong Lei Kuan, both of whom are executive Directors of the Company. Save as disclosed herein, he has no other relationships with any Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Tsang is the beneficial owner of 1,404,000 Shares and is deemed to be interested in another 568,034,750 Shares being controlled by the Tsang Family Trust, a discretionary trust established by Dr. Tsang Hin Chi, the discretionary objects of which are members of his family including Mr. Tsang. Save as aforesaid, he has no other interest in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Mr. Tsang is entitled to annual emoluments of approximately HK\$2,880,000 which are determined with reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Company. In addition, he is also entitled to receive an annual bonus to be determined by reference to the Group's performance and profitability.

Mr. Tsang has entered into a service agreement with the Company with no specific term but can be terminated by either party giving to the other six months' notice. He is subject to retirement and eligible for re-election at the Annual General Meeting of the Company in accordance with the Articles of Association of the Company.

Save as disclosed herein, there is no other information relating to Mr. Tsang's re-election that needs to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of Rule 13.51 (2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters relating to his re-election that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Mr. Ng Ming Wah, Charles, (*Non-executive Director*) aged 57, was appointed to the Board in 1992. Mr. Ng graduated from Loughborough University in England in 1972 with a B.Sc. degree in Electronic and Electrical Engineering and from London Graduate School of Business Studies (London Business School) in England in 1974 with a M.Sc. degree in Business Studies. He is the Managing Director of Equitas Capital Limited, the business of which is the provision of strategic corporate financial advisory services. Mr. Ng has over 25 years of experience in corporate finance and investment banking. Mr. Ng is an independent non-executive director of each of China Everbright Limited (stock code: 165), Stone Group Holdings Limited (stock code: 409) and Dalian Ports (PDA) Company Limited (stock code: 2880). Mr. Ng also holds independent directorships in China Everbright Bank Company, Limited and Luoyang Luanchuan Molybdenum (Group) Company, Limited, which are, respectively, a licensed commercial bank and a molybdenum mining company on the China Mainland. In addition, Mr. Ng holds a number of community service positions in Hong Kong including as a member of the Council of Lingnan University of Hong Kong and a member of the Board of Governors of Hong Kong Arts Centre.

Mr. Ng is not connected with any Directors, senior management or substantial and controlling shareholders of the Company, and as at the Latest Practicable Date, apart from a long position of 410,000 Shares, he does not have any other interests in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

There is no service contract between the Company and Mr. Ng. Mr. Ng is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election pursuant to the Company's Articles of Association. Currently, Mr. Ng is entitled to receive an aggregate annual remuneration of HK\$180,000 which comprises a director's fee of HK\$100,000, additional remuneration in respect of his membership in Board committees, being HK\$50,000 as a member of the Audit Committee, HK\$20,000 as a member of the Remuneration Committee and HK\$10,000 as a member of the Nomination Committee in accordance with Ordinary Resolution numbered (8) approved at the Company's Annual General Meeting held on 19th May 2006. Upon re-election, the aggregate annual remuneration of Mr. Ng as a non-executive Director will remain unchanged.

In the three years prior to the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Ng had been an independent non-executive director of each of Zhaojin Mining Industry Company Limited (stock code: 1818) (term of service: 16th October 2004 to 16th April 2007) and Huangshan Novel Co., Ltd., a company listed on the Shenzhen Stock Exchange (term of service: 8th March 2002 to 20th August 2004). Mr. Ng was also a non-executive director of Man Wah Enterprise Company Limited ("Man Wah Enterprise") from 6th December 1994 to 27th July 1995. Man Wah Enterprise was a Hong Kong company incorporated on 24th November 1970 and was engaged in silk flower manufacturing business. On 19th September, 1995 the directors of Man Wah Enterprise filed a statutory declaration with the Companies Registry pursuant to Section 228A of the Companies Ordinance to the effect that they were of the opinion that the company could not by reason of its liabilities continue its business and that it was necessary that the company be wound up. On 13th October 1995, a petition for the winding up of Man Wah Enterprise was filed by a creditor in court. On 22nd November 1995, a winding up order on Man Wah Enterprise was made by the court pursuant to the said petition. On 3rd April 1996, an application was made by the liquidators to the court pursuant to Section 209A of the Companies Ordinance to have the liquidation of Man Wah Enterprise conducted as if it were a creditors' voluntary winding up. Upon such application, an order was made by the court on 2nd May 1996 that the winding up of Man Wah Enterprise should be conducted as if the winding-up were a creditors' voluntary winding-up. Man Wah Enterprise was dissolved on 24th September 1999. According to the report of the liquidator and the official receiver dated 1st May 1996, proofs of debts of a total value of approximately HK\$3,300,000 had been submitted up to that date (of which approximately 65% in amount were submitted by shareholders of Man Wah Enterprise and their associates) and the official receiver held cash in the sum of approximately HK\$280,000 at that date. Mr. Ng has confirmed that there was no wrongful act on his part leading to the winding up of Man Wah Enterprise and that, as far as he was aware, no actual or potential claim had been or would be made against him as a result of such winding up. The liquidators concluded in their report in 1996 that they were of the view that this liquidation was not a matter of public concern. Mr. Ng also confirmed that other than those matters disclosed herein, he was not involved in any matters relating to the winding up of Man Wah Enterprise.

Mr. Ng has extensive experience in corporate finance and investment banking and also holds directorships in several listed companies in Hong Kong. He considers that the above incident has no impact on his character, experience and integrity to act as a Director of the Company. In his long length of service with the Company since 1992, Mr. Ng considers that in the performance of his duties as a Director, he has always acted for proper purpose, honestly and in good faith in the interests of the Company as a whole, and applies such degree of skill, care and diligence as may reasonably be expected of a person of his knowledge and experience and holding his office within the Company. Mr. Ng considers that he has demonstrated a high standard of competence that is required by the applicable provisions in Rules 3.08 and 3.09 of the Listing Rules. Based on these factors, the Board of Directors considers and concludes that Mr. Ng has the character, experience and integrity and is able to demonstrate a standard of competence commensurate with his position as a Director of the Company.

Save as disclosed herein, there is no other information relating to Mr. Ng's re-election that needs to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of Rule 13.51 (2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters relating to his re-election that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

- (b) the aggregate nominal amount of shares in the capital of the Company which may be repurchased by the Company pursuant to the approval in paragraph (a) during the Relevant Period shall not exceed 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the shares in the capital of the Company in issue as at the date of the passing of this resolution; and
 - (c) for the purposes of this resolution, "Relevant Period" means the period from the date of the passing of this resolution until whichever is the earlier of:
 - (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company;
 - (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Companies Ordinance (Chapter 32 of the Laws of Hong Kong) or the Articles of Association of the Company to be held; and
 - (iii) the date on which the authority set out in this resolution is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the shareholders of the Company in general meeting."
6. "THAT:
- (a) subject to paragraph (c) of this resolution and pursuant to Section 57B of the Companies Ordinance (Chapter 32 of the Laws of Hong Kong) and the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited, the exercise by the Directors of the Company during the Relevant Period (as hereinafter defined) of all the powers of the Company to allot, issue and deal with unissued shares in the capital of the Company or securities convertible into shares in the capital of the Company and to make or grant offers, agreements and options (including bonds and debentures convertible into shares in the capital of the Company) which would or might require the exercise of such powers be and is hereby generally and unconditionally approved;

7. “**THAT**, subject to the passing of the above Resolutions numbered 5 and 6, the general mandate granted to the Directors of the Company pursuant to Resolution numbered 6 be and is hereby extended by the addition thereto of an amount representing the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company as stated in Resolution numbered 5 above provided that such amount shall not exceed 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the shares in the capital of the Company in issue on the date of the passing of this resolution.”
